Narrative description of the Prop 28 art education program(s) funded.

The Prop 28 funding for UPA is a critical funding support for the overall academic support of every student. Expanding a student's perspective beyond the core subjects helps students to understand the world in fundamentally unique ways. At UPA, the funding allows for the employment of a full time visual arts teacher. This high quality and experienced educator is able to engage students with: line drawing, perspective, charcoal drawing, acrylic and water color painting, clay, and other 3D media. Students are able to demonstrate their work at an end of year arts show. Without the Prop 28 funding, UPA would not be able to serve over 20% of the student body with a unique learning experience. Many students go on to take advanced art courses, including AP.
